Bellarmino-Jefferson High School, fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), strives to meet the individual needs while developing a spirit of community and social consciousness.

Because our students are college bound, our curriculum corresponds to the requirements for admission to most universities. Over 98% of Bellarmine-Jefferson High School graduates attend college and many receive scholarships, grants and/or financial aid.

All students are required to take a minimum of 270 credits including the following:

English.....	40 credits	Social Studies.....	35 credits

Electives including Physics, Photography, Acting, Chorus, Advanced Software, Psychology, Sociology, SAT Prep, Journalism, Three-Dimensional Art, Graphic Design, and Business Law are offered each year to enhance the educational experience.

Bellarmino-Jefferson is a college preparatory high school offering Advanced Placement, Honors and College Prep courses. Advanced Placement courses are offered in the following subjects: English, Spanish Language, U.S. History, Calculus, and Chemistry.

The Campus Ministry program has its fundamental roots in the mission and ministry of the Church.

Bellarmino-Jefferson enforces a uniform dress code as follows:

- BOYS: uniform pants or shorts, authorized white shirt, uniform sweater or jacket.
- GIRLS: uniform pants, shorts or skirt, authorized white blouse, uniform sweater or jacket.

Our Student Activity Program offers a variety of clubs and events to enrich the academic, cultural and career interests of our students. Some of the clubs and events include California Scholarship Federation, Beta Club, Academic Decathlon, National Honors Society, Pep Club, Model United Nations, and Big Sister/Brother Day.

Bellarmino-Jefferson offers a wide range of sports programs designed to develop skill and discipline through instruction and training. Bell-Jeff participates in the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF).

HOW DO I APPLY FOR GRADE 9? *Applicants for Grades 10 and 11: Contact Dir. of Admissions

1. Send the Admission Application and \$50 fee to BJHS. This registers you for the Entrance Test.
2. A parent/guardian must sign and submit the Elementary School Recommendation to your school.
3. Come visit...meet our students, faculty and administrators at Open House in December.
4. Entrance Test taken at BJHS...Saturday, January 26th or Saturday, February 2nd.
 - ❖ Only those who take the test in January or February at BJHS will be considered for interviews.
 - ❖ Only those who take the test in January or February at BJHS are eligible for financial aid.
5. Teacher recommendation and transcripts are sent from your school to BJHS.
6. Student and parents interview with a member of the Admissions Committee.
7. Letters of acceptance sent by mid-March.
